## NEW ZEALAND'S DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE

### NZAID snapshot

- NZAID is the Government's international aid and development agency.
- In 2008/09 NZAID will spend \$471.3 million on overseas development assistance.

### The funding opportunities

#### Kaihono hei Oranga Hapori o te Ao – Partnerships for International Community Development (KOHA-PICD)

This is a co-funding scheme for New Zealand non-government organisations (NGOs) focused on supporting community development activities through developing country NGO partners.

Financial support is provided for New Zealand-based project management costs and for appraisal, monitoring and evaluation visits.

The KOHA-PICD emphasises partnership, gender equity, participation, and strengthening the capacity of developing country counterparts.

#### Asian Development Assistance Facility – Partnerships for Sustainable Development (ADAF-PSD)

#### Latin American Development Assistance Facility – Partnerships for Sustainable Development (LADAF-PSD)

These provide funding opportunities for New Zealand organisations (in partnership with an

organisation from an eligible Asian country or Latin American country to respond to development priorities by contributing knowledge, skills and innovative approaches that enhance in-country initiatives to reduce poverty.

They are targeted towards New Zealand Crown entities, government departments and the private sector.

NGOs are not excluded but must be able to prove they are adding value in terms of their expertise and must be able to operate on an invoicing basis.
